This sanction is subject to the following conditions in addition to the terms stipulated in the Research Promotion Scheme guidelines.

- Those faculty who are on leave, will be able to avail benefit under this scheme, only after they re-join the University. However, they are hereby conveyed in-principle approval of their proposal.
  - Further, if a faculty proceeds on a long leave after availing the scheme, she/he will not utilize the amount during leave period. However, once she/he joins back, may continue availing benefits under the scheme w.e.f. their date of joining.
- 2. All the PI's will have to submit a request for advance and a revised budget (if their previous budget estimate was not in line with the breakup mentioned in the policy guidelines) latest by 08.02.2024. As per policy guidelines, the grant of Rs 2.0 Lakhs may be utilized as follows:
  - Rs 1.5 Lakhs for Minor equipment, books, journals and software(perpetual license)
  - 0.5 Lakhs (Rs 25k per year ) for contingency and consumables.
- An advance may be sanctioned for the following Sub-Heads: Purchase of Books and / or subscription of journals
  - ii. Contingency
  - iii. Travel and/ or Field Work, not including travel for attending seminars, conferences, workshops and training programmes (As per approved RPS Clause iv. Under Nature of assistance).
- All the PI's are requested to send the proposals (with i. detailed specifications of proposed items to be procured and ii. Advance required) addressed to the Director, RDC Prof. Sunil Kumar Srivastava (director.rdc@mgcub.ac.in with a cc to osdfinance@mgcub.ac.in), duly forwarded by concerned Head and Dean (latest by 08.02.2024). After receipt of the same, a consolidated procurement request will be sent to the Procurement Officer. In case of non-availability on GeM, the Procurement may be done (not exceeding limit in rule 155 of GFR-2017, in each case) through a Local Purchase Committee comprising of the following:
  - Head of the Department (Chairman)
  - Representative of the Dean (Member)
  - PI (Member Secretary)

- 5. It has been decided to allow re-imbursement of registration fee for attending a conference or similar academic/ research related programme, from the contingency component.
- 6. Further, it is expected that settlement of advance is done by 20<sup>th</sup> March,2024 so that the same may be utilized from the budget under Recurring head of the current financial year.
- 7. All the PI's will ensure to utilize the contingency amount, or any amount released to them, only for the specific purpose for which allocation is made, and in strict compliance of GFR-2017 and other applicable rules in the regard.
- 8. Travel claims will be settled as per University/ GoI rules.
- 9. All the PI's will have to submit Utilization Certificate in proper proforma after utilization of the advances. Any subsequent release will depend on the utilization certificate.
- 10. In case of any difficulty or ambiguity, the decision of RDC(with approval of competent authority) shall be final.
